

The role of EUC Dental Clinic

The primary role of the EUC Dental Clinic is the training of dental students to become qualified dentists with key skills and clinical competencies. The oral care provided by our dental students is overseen by highly experienced dentists, dental specialists and university professors. In this way, our patients receive high quality treatment while our students gain essential experience in an ideal learning environment.

Patients are charged reduced fees which cover the operating costs and services of the EUC Dental Clinic. The EUC Dental Clinic provides affordable, comprehensive and personal dental care ranging from simple to advanced, in one state-of-the-art location, by multilingual staff.

From December 2023 EUC Dental Clinic offers comprehensive orthodontic treatments to children, adolescents and adults.

EUC Dental Clinic Procedures and Regulations

Book an Appointment

The first step is to make an appointment with our reception by phone at 22559621 or by email to DentalClinic@euc.ac.cy. At your screening appointment, a comprehensive examination and other diagnostic aids such as x-rays may take place. You may bring x-rays from another provider, however, in most cases we need to take additional x-rays in order to provide a proper diagnosis and to develop an appropriate treatment plan. X-rays may also be emailed to the EUC Dental Clinic at dentxray@euc.ac.cy. We will evaluate your treatment needs, and you can schedule future appointments with the dental student.

Payments

Payments for dental treatment should be made by cash or credit cards.

Fee Estimates

EUC Dental Clinic patients will be advised on their appropriate treatment and the estimated costs, as well as any alternative treatment plans. Once you have understood and accepted your treatment plan, you and the supervising dentist or university professor must sign the Treatment Planning Form as well as the Informed Consent Form. The accepted Treatment Plan will be entered into your patient chart. At each visit, patients should be advised of the costs of each procedure and any additional lab costs so they are prepared for the subsequent charges. Please ask your assigned dental student if this is not clear.

Patient Inquiry

If you have any questions about your treatment, you should first contact your assigned dental student. Complaints should be addressed through your dental student to the Director of the EUC Dental Clinic. Payment is expected in full when the service is rendered with the exception of certain procedures that involve an external lab or expensive parts or materials that require a down payment to cover lab expenses.

Clinic Calendar

The EUC Dental Clinic is closed during national and religious holidays as well as during the university breaks. [Details should be provided according to the academic calendar]

Reminder Items for New Patients

Please bring to your first appointment a current photo ID and be aware of your medical history and prescribed medications. Your appointment may need to be rescheduled if this information is not available.

Treatment Policies

Comprehensive Care Patient selection is based upon the educational needs. Generally, comprehensive care will be recommended while advising the patient of the benefits and risks of this course of treatment, as well of the anticipated prognosis or outcome. At least one alternative treatment plan may be advised with its attendant benefits, risks and prognosis. Also the consequences of no treatment will be explained.

Please note: The EUC dental clinic is not obligated to provide any type of comprehensive or limited care, which in our judgment, is not in the best interest of the patient or requires reference to an external clinical facility.





Records

The EUC Dental Clinic has the primary custodial rights over your records, which are kept private and protected according to the law. You, as the patient, have a right to review or obtain or ask to transfer to another dental facility copies of your records. Copies of your records and radiographs (x-rays) will be provided to you or forwarded to another practitioner upon your signed written request. The original records will remain with the EUC Dental Clinic.

Appointments

Dental students provide all treatments at the EUC Dental Clinic. Your assigned dental student will schedule your appointment. Clinic starts promptly at your appointed time, Monday through Friday. You should plan to have available at least four hours during the week for your dental treatment. This may be two 2-hour appointments, or one 3 hour appointment depending on the nature of the procedure. Since you are being treated by dental students who will be overseen by experienced dentists, specialists or university professors, your appointments may be longer and possibly less treatment will be rendered than if you were treated by a private dentist.

Appointment Cancellation

Appointments should be cancelled only if it is absolutely necessary and at least 24 hours in advance by calling the reception of the EUC Dental Clinic at 22559621. In cases of extreme emergency you should inform your dental student by sms, email or phone.

Three failures to keep appointments in one year or failure to meet appointment times without notice will result in the termination of your treatment. Please remember your dental student depends on you to come to your appointments as there is a limited amount of time for them to achieve the necessary clinical experience for graduation.

Patient Bill of Rights

The EUC Dental Clinic accepts all patients with dental needs which are considered appropriate for teaching students contemporary techniques of dentistry regardless of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, gender, age, marital status, disability, public assistance status, or sexual orientation. However, we reserve the right to refuse treatment, except to relieve pain or protect life, to any person for the following reasons:

- The patient has a history of not abiding by the patient responsibilities listed below.
- The patient's conduct is disruptive or harms the students' education.
- The patient has a history of not fulfilling his or her financial obligations to the EUC Dental Clinic.

Your rights as our patient are important to us and we encourage you to let us know if you feel we have not lived up to our pledge or if you feel that your rights were not honored. After your initial appointment, you will have one or more additional appointments to determine your personal treatment plan depending on the complexity of your case.



Patient Rights and Responsibilities

Patient has the right:

- To be provided with appropriate information about providers, policies and procedures;
- To be informed by your dentist regarding your diagnosis, treatment and prognosis in terms you can understand and you have the right to ask any relevant questions;
- To receive enough information from your dentist to enable you to give informed consent before beginning any dental procedure or treatment;
- To be treated with respect, dignity and with recognition of your privacy;
- To refuse treatment, medication or other procedures recommended by EUC Dental Clinic providers and to the extent permitted by law and to be made aware of the potential consequences of refusing recommended treatment;
- To expect that all communications and records pertaining to your health will be handled in the most confidential manner;
- To express any concern with the staff of the EUC Dental Clinic.

Patient has the responsibility:

- To provide, to the best of your knowledge, accurate and complete information about your present health, dental complaints, past illnesses, hospitalizations, medications and other matters pertaining to your health;
- To report any changes in your health since your last appointment to your attending dental student:
- To tell your dental student if you do not understand the treatment plans developed for you or if you do not understand the course of your treatment or what is expected of you;
- To treat others with the same respect and courtesy that you expect for yourself;
- To weigh the potential consequences of not following the advice of your dental care provider;
- To keep and follow the scheduled appointments with providers or give adequate notice of cancellation to the EUC Dental Clinic;
- To express your concerns to the EUC Dental Clinic staff;
- To provide information needed by your dental care provider to enable him/her to provide the most appropriate and effective care;
- To meet your financial obligations in a timely fashion;
- To perform visual in-mouth examinations on yourself and to responsibly follow the provider's instructions regarding home care treatment;

Note: Periodically, EUC Dental Clinic will conduct patient surveys as part of our continuous improvement initiatives. By completing these surveys, you contribute to making these services better.
